The Horsham District Older Peoples Forum are working with Age UK Horsham, Healthwatch West Sussex, WSCC & HDC to ascertain the realities and experiences of local people living in the Horsham District, of their hospital treatment 'from getting there to getting home'

This project will likely encompass, (for starters I think anyway), issues raised at Horsham District Older Peoples Forum public meetings, of actually getting to hospital(s) whether as a patient or visitor, the transport difficulties, availability of buses and cost of taxis, long distances there and back, car parking and the fees. What support if any was offered on discharge from hospital?

The statistics show the 10 most used hospitals are Worthing, East Surrey, St Richards Chichester, Crawley, Royal Surrey, Princess Royal Haywards Heath, Royal Sussex Brighton, Queen Victoria East Grinstead, Goring Hall, Horsham hospital.

From the statistics we can see for example how many hospitals are used, how far people have to travel and from where in the District, the number of admissions, age groups, where patients are discharged to etc.etc.

Post Finsbury Park Attack

Following the terror attack in London outside the Muslim Welfare House on Seven Sisters Road, near Finsbury Park Mosque, the Police Service will continue to review how we are addressing community reassurance, safety and security.

As you will be aware, the victims were from the Muslim community, observing Ramadan. It is natural that there will be heightened concerns within our Muslim communities in Sussex, at local mosques and in surrounding communities and while details continue to emerge about this attack, our policing stance is continuously being reviewed in order for us to keep people safe. In Surrey and Sussex we continue to build flexibility within our patrols, and will be continuing to include local mosques within our targeted patrol plans.

As we approach the end of the month of Ramadan and the celebration of Eid, we are liaising with local Muslim groups and mosques to talk through any concerns and will be providing targeted police patrols to help reassure our local communities. Please can you let me or the District Commanders know if you hear of any concerns within our communities.

As you will be aware, terrorism and extremism is not limited to people from any particular background, as this event reminds us all, and it is important that we all remain vigilant as we tackle the on-going terrorist threats from people with various motivations.

We all know that community intelligence is crucial to helping us prevent future attacks and we need to continue to ensure we are all part of the Prevent agenda and activity to combat terrorism. I would be grateful if you could please continue to remind all your staff of the important role they can play in keeping the country safe and the responsibilities they have to look out for anything suspicious or any
