Summer opening hours at Household Waste and Recycling Sites

From 1 April, household waste recycling sites (HWRS) in West Sussex will open for longer to cater for increased demand in the summer months.

The majority of sites will open at 9am, apart from Bognor, Crawley and Littlehampton which will open at 8.30am on weekdays.

Worthing, Westhampnett, Burgess Hill and Crawley will be open seven days a week.

All sites will stay open until 6pm.

In line with normal practice, the summer opening hours at all HWRS will take effect from 1 April and run through until 30 September 2018.

It outlines work on:


- Prevention educating the community on how to reduce risks.

- Partnership and collaboration how we will work with other organisations.

Operation Watershed Continues

Given the significant challenges to reduce public spending, but recognising the aspiration of community groups to actively address flood risk issues themselves West Sussex County Council will make available Capital funding of £300k via Operation Watershed Active Communities Fund for the financial year 2018/19.

West Sussex County Council continues to encourage Parish and Town Councils and community groups to consider the fund if they have flood related projects.



The evolution of the Operation Watershed to capital funding requires some changes to the criteria applicants will need to meet to receive grant funding for their projects. Full details please go to www.westsussex.gov.uk/watershed

Contact your local County Councillor to discuss any potential project and officers will continue to work closely with communities as and when they come forward on individual applications.

Members support for their community groups applying for project funding continues to be a prerequisite for approval of applications.

Thinking of Applying for Community Highways Scheme?



A reminder to all Parishes, Town Councils and Communities that applications for Community Highway Improvements can be submitted via our <u>online</u> application form.

To be considered for selection for design/feasibility in the next financial year we need to have received your application by the end of August this year.

Successful applications last year are due to be taken forward for feasibility and design in our Annual Delivery programme next year. Delivery of these schemes will be from 19/20 onwards, depending on complexity.

We get a wide range of schemes and these include footpath and cycle links, traffic calming, junction improvements and improved crossing facilities.

Scheme applications must be supported by your local member and will need to demonstrate community support. The application form asks for scheme details including scope, objectives and benefits. All Applications are assessed and prioritised by a moderation panel consisting of members from the Highways management team.
