# Schools Effectiveness Strategy – have you taken part yet?



A new School Effectiveness Strategy is currently being developed which will outline how the County Council will work with education providers over the next four years to ensure that all West Sussex children and young people really do get the best start in life. It will replace the current Strategy for School Improvement 2016-2019.

The new School Effectiveness Strategy will underpin the aims in the <u>West Sussex Plan 2017-2022</u> to meet the County Council's vision of "Improving educational outcomes in West Sussex by championing all our children and young people".

The County Council wants to listen to everyone that is involved in education provision across West Sussex. To create strong partnership working, the views of all stakeholders are being sought in this consultation on a Draft Strategy. Schools, educational settings, academy trusts, the Dioceses, other organisations, parent, carers, children and young people are invited to comment.

We would like to invite your comments on the Draft School Effectiveness Strategy to help ensure that the County Council is taking the right steps to improve educational outcomes in West Sussex.

Falls Prevention Workshop - 22nd June 2018

Falls and injuries sustained due to a fall are a common and serious problem for older people. People aged 65 and older have the highest risk of falling, with 30% of people older than 65, and 50% of people older than 80 falling at least once a year.

If you provide falls prevention support, advice or physical activity opportunities or if you signpost to services, we invite you to our falls prevention workshop, taking place on the 22nd June at 1pm in Horsham.



#### What do we want to do?

The aim of this workshop is to identify the range of services and activities which support older people in preventing falls. This will enable us to gain a better understanding of provision across the whole of West Sussex and to work together to increase access and streamline referral processes.

We are aware that work has already taken place to identify services are available to our residents in some areas – it would be helpful to include this as part of the workshop.

This session will be hosted at County Hall North (The Park Suite) at 1:00pm – 3:30pm on the 22th June 2018.

## **The Food Hygiene Rating Scheme**



We need your help to gain residents' views about food standards and food hygiene concerning West Sussex businesses via an <u>online questionnaire</u>.

not to buy food from a business?

The Food Hygiene Rating Scheme helps you choose where to eat out or shop for food by giving you clear information about a business's hygiene standards.

The scheme gives businesses a rating from 5 (very good) to 0 (urgent improvement necessary).

With the right support and encouragement, we believe that we can help our lower scoring food businesses make the necessary changes to improve their food hygiene ratings.

### **There But Not There**

The installation of 51 transparent seated military figures in Penshurst Church over Remembrance 2016 lit a touch paper in the psyche of all who saw it.



Given that widespread resonance, There But Not There aims to place a representative figure for as many as

possible of the names on local war memorials, around the country, into their place of worship, their school, their workplace or wherever their absence was keenly felt. These transparent silhouettes will be back within their communities for Remembrance 2018, the centenary commemoration of the end of the 1914-1918 First World War.

There But Not There will be the defining centenary commemoration of the end of the 1914-1918 war, installed where the men and women came from across the country, back in the communities they left behind.

The Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust will be opening a programme in the summer making very small grants to communities who want to engage in this activity but where there are financial barriers to them doing so.

Grants of up to £500 will be available for communities to purchase a small number of silhouettes that can be placed in places of worship and community spaces. As part of their project communities will need to hold an event to bring people together to remember; and to think about the Armed Forces Community today.
