A campaign to ensure people are getting the right care at the right time, and are not putting NHS services under unnecessary strain, is being launched during #HelpMyNHS week from 27 November to 1 December. The NHS is doing everything it can with the resources it has to prepare for the extra pressures we expect to face this winter. Now, #HelpMyNHS is calling on the public to play their part by adopting small behavioural changes to ease pressures on local health and care services, saving them for those in the most need. It asks people to #HelpMyA&E by:

- highlighting the alternative services to A&E and when these should be used.
- using GP appointments properly, take steps to help prevent getting ill and self-manage minor illnesses, as well as using alternative services, such as pharmacists.
