Hate posters discovered in Horsham

News Witness Appeals

Sussex Police are appealing for witnesses after reports of hate posters in Barns Green, <u>Horsham</u>.

The posters with political figures on them are believed to have been put up in Chapel Road between 9.45pm and 11.30pm on Monday (19 November).

Horsham Prevention Inspector Sarah Leadbeatter said: "We are taking this matter very seriously and will investigate all lines of enquiry.

"There will be an increase in high visibility patrols in the area and residents are encouraged to speak to the officers with any information they have.

"We are urging anyone with CCTV footage or information on the incident to report it to us without delay."

Horsham swimming group receives cash boost

A <u>Horsham</u> swimming group has benefited from a cash boost from Sussex Police.

Sunbeam, a swimming club for people of all ages with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND), received a £500 cheque through the Police Property Act Fund.

This is made up of monies received by the police from the sale of found property, and from property confiscated by order of the court and then sold.

Swimming coach Sarah Burling said: "The money we have received from the police fund will ease the pressure on the committee to raise money to pay for the hire of the pool.

"The money will also be put towards our first ever swimming gala in 2020. Having enjoyed so many galas run by other swimming clubs in Sussex and Surrey, we are all looking forward to hosting our own event and welcoming swimmers to The Pavilions in Horsham."

The money was secured by PCSO Laura Webber from the Adur, Worthing and Horsham Prevention Team.

She added: "I am really pleased we were able to provide the group with extra funding that will help the group tremendously.

"It is a brilliant group who are all very welcoming and I wish them the best for the future in particular for their gala."
