Police looking for wanted man Thomas Keatley

Police are looking for Thomas Keatley who is wanted on recall to prison for breaching the terms of his licence.

Keatley, 33, formerly of Brighton Road, Lancing, was released from prison after being jailed for eight years for possession of a firearm with intent to endanger life in October 2013.

Keatley has links to Lancing, Brighton, Worthing and Crawley. He is white, of heavy build with black hair.

Man arrested and charged for seven offences

A man has been charged with seven offences after being arrested by officers in Chichester.

Edward Butler, 44, was stopped by police on Sheepwash Lane, Lavant, on Wednesday (December 12).

Butler, from Havant, Hampshire, was arrested and charged with three counts of receiving stolen goods, theft from a motor vehicle, dangerous driving, failing to stop and driving without insurance. He was also arrested for offences in Horsham District Rural car parks. He pleaded not guilty at Crawley Magistrates' Court on Friday (December 14) and was remanded in custody to next appear at Portsmouth Crown Court on 11 January.

Steyning Police Station

Steyning Police Station to temporarily close on the 24 December to enable a refurbishment of the facilities available to both staff and the public.

We recognise the need to keep pace with advances happening elsewhere in society so that we are fit to provide policing services to the public not just in the short-term, but for many years to come. To allow for this, reinvestment into the towns we serve is at the forefront of our Estates strategy. We are keen to ensure agile working solutions enable our staff and officers to work more flexibly, not being tied to one location, but using technology to make the most efficient use of our workspaces to serve our communities in the best way possible.

As a result, we will be refurbishing Steyning Police Station. We aim to invest in the site and make a vastly improved area for both the public, our officers and staff.

Sussex Police and Crime Commissioner Katy Bourne said, "Public contact points, like this one, are a key part of the reassuring footprint of policing for communities across Sussex, but they are also places of work for our police officers and staff.

"The ongoing modernisation programme of the Sussex Police estate is transforming tired buildings like this one into more efficient buildings that are designed and equipped for 21st century policing."

As part of the refurbishment, the front office will be completely renovated, and essential building maintenance will take place. To enable these works to take place, Steyning Police Station will close from 25 December until 6 May 2019.

While this refurbishment takes place a mobile community engagement van will be available for the public where they can meet Police Community Support Officers for advice and guidance. It will be located in a centralised position on the High Street. Available every **Tuesday and Friday between the hours of 12-2, starting**

from Friday the 4 January.

Until that date and throughout the refurbishment, the public will also have access to a yellow phone on the existing site, which can be used 24 hours a day to report crime or speak to us about any concerns. This will be available throughout the refurbishment and will not be affected in any way.

After the refurbishment, Steyning Police Station will have an improved front desk area for the public and offer an open plan space that will make the very best use of the building.

We are still receiving reports of vehicles being entered, these are mainly vehicles that have been left insecure. Please ensure all vehicle are locked and secured at all times.
