Two await sentence for Horsham and Chichester burglaries

Two men appeared before Brighton magistrates on New Year's Day charged with a string of commercial burglaries in Sussex, Surrey and Hampshire. Both were remanded in custody to await sentence at Lewes Crown Court on Monday, 28 January.

Andrew Richard Lewin, 43, unemployed, of Eldon Road, Caterham, Surrey, and Gary Roland Reilly, 51, a railway worker, of Purley Vale, Purley, Surrey, were arrested in Guildford on Sunday, 30 December.

Lewin denied a charge of being jointly involved with Reilly in entering Grosvenor House, Station Road, Sunbury-on-Thames, on 11 November with intent to steal. Reilly admitted the offence.

Both men pleaded guilty to being jointly concerned in the following: On 20 November entering Springfield Road, Horsham, and stealing a quantity of Dell laptops and a bottle of champagne; on the same date and at the same location attempting to enter Anys and Kreston Reeves with intent to steal; on 27 December at the Chichester Enterprise Centre in Terminus Road, Chichester, entering Dropship Spy Ltd and stealing a Samsung TV; entering New World Ltd and stealing a Samsung mobile phone; entering Oak Construction Ltd and stealing an IBM computer; entering Rodd Brown Ltd and stealing a Lenovo laptop; entering Arkle Acquisitions Ltd and stealing a cashbox containing £20 cash; entering Book Folly Ltd with intent to steal; entering Springhouse Solicitors with intent to steal; on 28 December entering Data 2 Basepoint, Caxton Close, Portway, Andover, Hampshire, and stealing an unknown number of laptops.

Following the hearing, Detective Sergeant Jason Vickers, of Sussex Police, said: "This was a complex case involving investigations by officers across three counties, but close co-operation and dedicated police work has resulted in these persistent offenders being brought before justices and admitting their crimes."

Call for witnesses after fire destroys camper van in Southwater, Horsham

Detectives investigating a blaze at Southwater, Horsham, in which a camper van was destroyed and a nearby annexe was damaged have appealed for witnesses.

They would like anyone who saw anything suspicious or who may have other relevant information to come forward.

The alarm was raised at 3am on Sunday 23 December. The camper van was parked on a driveway at Foxfield Cottages close to its junction with Andrews Road. No one was hurt.

Subsequent examination suggested the fire was started deliberately and police are keen to speak to anyone with knowledge of the incident.

Operation Encompass - new Sussex-wide scheme supports children who witness domestic abuse

A new scheme to help children who witness domestic abuse in the home is going Sussex-wide.

Following the successful launch of Operation Encompass in West and East Sussex, the innovative domestic abuse notification process to support children is now being rolled out to the majority of schools in Brighton in January 2019. So after 12 months of work the majority of schools in Sussex are now signed up to the process.

Operation Encompass is a safeguarding partnership between police and education. It is a simple but efficient way in which information from the police can be shared in strictest confidence with a school key adult, to provide that child or young person with appropriate support in dealing with a potentially traumatic domestic abuse experience they have witnessed or been subjected to at home.

When police find that child or young person has been involved in or exposed to a domestic abuse incident, the school will be notified before the start of the next school day, in addition to other action police may be taking to deal with the matter.

So far police have made more than 1200 notifications to schools in West

Sussex, enabling them to take steps to support children, the vast majority relating to experiences they have witnessed.

Based in our Force Contact, Command and Control Centre on the outskirts of Lewes, Contact Handlers work shifts, including nights, weekends and bank holidays. Part time shift patterns are possible, depending on requirements.

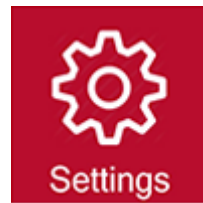
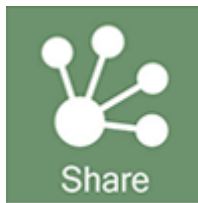
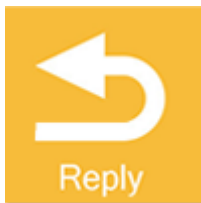
