

Piries Place car park nearing completion

The finishing touches are being made to the five-level car park in Piries Place, Horsham.

The new car park will have wider, deeper bays than the old design and 516 spaces – 189 more than the previous car park. Plus, there will be new toilets and a Changing Places facility.



The living wall is the car park's most iconic feature. The design is based on the form of a tree and complements the tree motifs featured on the screens along the sides of the car park. Not only does the wide variety of plants living on the wall improve the look of the car park, they will also provide several environmental benefits including the absorption and capture of air pollution, particulate matter and carbon dioxide. The wall will also increase biodiversity in the area as a place for insects and wildlife to live.

The car park is due to be completed very soon, so watch this space.
