The Neighbourhood Warden Scheme grows even more!

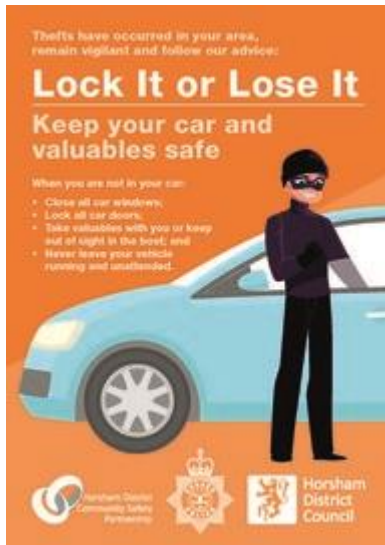
The Horsham District now has seven Neighbourhood Warden schemes in operation in the following parishes, each with two wardens: Ashington, Billingshurst, Horsham Town Centre, Pulborough, Southwater, Storrington and a joint scheme in Steyning, Bramber and Upper Beeding.

The warden scheme is managed by Horsham District Council on behalf of the Parish Councils and we have recently recruited a new Warden Supervisor to manage the team of 14.

Don't make a glaring error this autumn

We are entering the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness - a time when the leaves are ablaze with colour and the sun is low in the sky. But once the leaves have fallen, the roads can become slippery and the low sun can easily dazzle drivers. Here are some tips to keep you safe on the roads this autumn.

- Slow down if you are dazzled by the sun's glare and keep a pair of sunglasses in the car, so they are easily accessible.
 - Keep windscreens clean and sort out scratches and chips, as they can intensify the sun's glare.
 - Bear in mind that if the sun is behind you, drivers coming towards you may not be able to see you as easily.
 - Be particularly careful around schools. It may be more difficult to see children walking and cycling due to the low sun.
 - Drive more slowly on leaf-covered roads and allow for increased stopping times.
 - Fog and mist can make the roads wet and slippery as well as reducing visibility.
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Seasonal advice

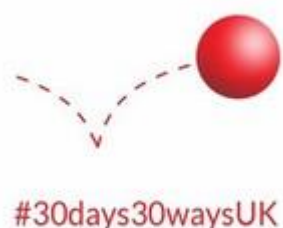
It's difficult to know whether the weather will be scorching, freezing, wet or just colourful this autumn. Whatever the weather decides to do, we have information to share.
